Holiday Cottages

Opened in 2005, our self-catering holiday homes at Barclay Farm are converted from a traditional farm steading. Once a milking byre, the two spacious self-contained cottages are of very fine quality, tastefully decorated and fully equipped. Ideally placed for walking and cycling, they are situated in an elevated position on an 840 acre farm and command stunning views of Barclay Hill to the North and across Bonnie Galloway to the Carsphairn Hills. Just five miles from the harbour town of Kirkcudbright with its fine collection of art galleries, shops and cafes, Barclay Milk and Honey House lie in the historic and magical Parish of Rerrick.

Both houses have oil fired central heating. Washing machines and tumble driers are in an adjacent building. Each fully equipped kitchen includes electric cooker and hob, dishwasher, fridge - freezer, microwave and coffee machine. Both houses have a TV, DVD player and portable stereo. Gardens are enclosed with garden furniture and barbeque. Baby facilities (cot, highchair and buggy) can be made available on request. Sorry no pets. No smoking.



The **Milk House** which sleeps 4 has an open plan kitchen-dining room fully fitted with a stainless steel sink and modern units and is tiled throughout. The living room has a patio door to the garden which has a decking area and lawn. There are two bedrooms. One has a king sized bed and the other, two singles. Bedrooms and living room all have rugs on wooden floors. The bathroom has a combined shower-bath and is tiled throughout.

The **Honey House** sleeps 6 and comprises a large fully fitted kitchen with Belfast sink and modern units, a dining area and living room with patio door to decking and lawn area. There are two double bedrooms. One has a king sized bed and en-suite bathroom with shower which is tiled throughout. The second has a double brass bed (very spacious for one but intimate for two!) The third bedroom has twin beds. The main bathroom has a Victorian style roll top bath and wooden floor. The cottage is wooden floored throughout with rugs.

The Farm

Our 840 acre southern upland farm belonged to the Cally Estate until 1914 and ever since has been family owned and run, first as a dairy and sheep farm and latterly beef and sheep. Due to retirement of the last "real" farmer and ongoing changes in agriculture most of the land has been let out in grass parks for the last fifteen years.

We have still got our own flock of Mules and Soay sheep and try to rear them as naturally as possible. Large parts of the farm are semi natural heath and wetland with extensive wild- and birdlife. Through various supporting measures we try to increase biodiversity on the farm.



We produce honey from our own small apiary, vegetables and eggs from our own hens. Home produce can be purchased. Walking can be enjoyed on the farm and a climb up Barclay Hill (268m) on a clear day is rewarded by 360 degree views of the area and coastline.

The Area

We're just five miles from Kirkcudbright - harbour town and artists' colony past and present - with its cafes, antique, craft shops and galleries. Places to visit include the Wildlife Conservation Park and Broughton House (National Trust) historic home of artist E.A.Hornel. River boat trips can be taken out of Kirkcudbright up to Ross Island - scene of the towns' most famous murder! The area offers excellent opportunities for walking (on the farm or in the region), cycling (we are quite central to most of the 7 Stanes tracks) and horse riding as well as bird watching and golfing (several 9 and 18 hole courses and driving ranges nearby). You can visit an organic ice-cream farm at 'Cream of Galloway' or the old Bladnoch Distillery. The Solway Coast is scattered with unspoiled beaches and there are opportunities for garden lovers too including Threave Gardens (National Trust) just outside Castle-Douglas.
